

**Lost Boys and Lost Girls Personal History Project
Personal History Record Request Form**

From 1989—2001 Sweden Save the Children collected personal information on South Sudanese children, commonly known by the name “Lost Boys and Lost Girls”, in hopes that the information would help to reunify these children with their families. The war continued for too long for this to be successful. In 2005, Sweden Save the Children designated AZ Lost Boys Center in Phoenix, Arizona as the repository for digital copies of these records, for the purpose of returning personal history documents to their rightful owners—the young men and women formerly known as the Lost Boys and Girls of Sudan. If you wish to obtain your personal history record, we would like to help!

To request a copy of your personal history record, please provide the following information as completely as possible. If we are unable to locate your record in the database, we will let you know.
